Testers look for games that will become “classics” based upon their likelihood to inspire children, provide fun in unique ways, offer learning opportunities that are challenging and spontaneous, encourage open-ended creativity, and foster engaging family time between parents and children.

The key element of fun in *Jeepers Peepers* is that, to begin, a child places a photo card of an object or animal (without looking at the photo) into a slot on a pair of goofy, round, oversized glasses. Wearing these glasses, the child faces the other players and, by asking a series of questions, tries to figure out what item is on the card. Every player wears their own set of glasses and takes as many turns as time will allow. After naming the items on the cards, players spin an electronic spinner and earn tokens.
