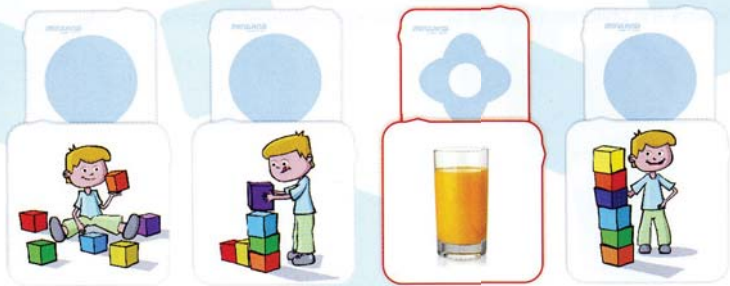


Activity 1

Determine which one does not belong in the sequence. Prepare the material by separating the sequences and including a game piece that does not belong in each (a piece from another sequence). The child must determine which piece does not belong. Organize the sequences and pay attention to the markings on the backside of the pieces.

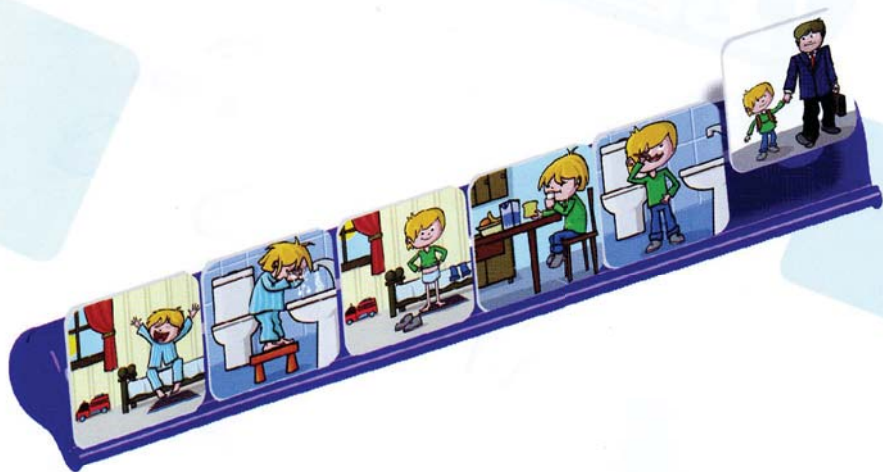
The game allows players to evaluate their own performance by flipping the pieces over and checking the markings. The piece that does not belong has different markings.



Activity 2

Enhance verbal expression and vocabulary. Arrange events in sequential order. Show a previously arranged sequence, horizontally and from left to right. Ask the child to verbalize the sequence in the form of a story, following the reading order. This will encourage use of chronological concepts like "first", "then" and "later".

Once the child has verbalized all the sequences, take them out of order and ask the child to put them back in order on the base.

Activity 3

Participate in body language activities, following a logical sequential order. Arrange events in sequential order.

Place a sequence on the stand in a place where it is visible to one child only. The child must act it out and the group must guess which sequence it is. This should be done until all sequences have been acted out.

Afterwards, the children may take turns putting a particular sequence in order.
